



2014-2015 FINANCIAL YEAR @ A GLANCE:

- Grants for conservation projects remain steady at around \$90,000 p.a.
- Income from general donations increased by 75% to \$34,500
- A change in accounting policies requires that we now record grants as liabilities until spent. This is reflected in the published accounts but not in the graphs, which report cash received during the year. The funds held in this amounted to \$93,000 at 31st March, 2015.
- From 1st April, 2015 we have brought the finances in-house
