A Rocha Aotearoa New Zealand is part of the A Rocha family of Christian environmental conservation organisations currently active in 22 countries around the world. As a family, we focus on environmental science and research, practical nature conservation, environmental education, creation care and advocacy through a variety of programmes and initiatives.

In Aotearoa New Zealand, we seek to inspire, educate and enable communities to care for our unique environment. A Rocha Aotearoa NZ is actively engaged in practical community conservation work through our network of local group projects and the Karioi Project. These offer opportunities for volunteer involvement across the country. We are also involved in resourcing, empowering and building relationships among all those wanting to integrate creation care and sustainability into the life of the church in Aotearoa NZ through our Eco Church NZ project.

A Rocha Aotearoa New Zealand (ARANZ) was registered as a charity in 2008 and our charity registration number is CC36274.

To protect and restore the environment through community-based conservation projects, research, and education.

Together we want to see ecosystems restored and communities all across Aotearoa New Zealand actively caring for the earth.

MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

As Chair, I never cease to be amazed at how much ARANZ achieves with so few people. A special shout out to Kristel, our inspiring director, and Iris, the administrator par excellence. We have a programme which spans field education for young children and teenagers in Raglan and in other parts of the country, intensive monitoring and investigation of traps and birds on a rugged seaside mountain, coordination of educational programmes and volunteers, together with our fledgling eco-church initiative. All of this is skillfully maintained and managed by Kristel and Iris.

We have had an encouraging year. In spite of post–COVID stresses and anxieties we have soft launched and then grown the Eco Church programme at a time when denominations were searching for answers and resources. Some churches around the country have extensive programmes and others are just starting on the journey. Eco Church has underlined our Christian convictions and the need for Christians to be thinking about climate and creation care. The programme also brings together churches from around the country, and is encouraging to local leaders who have often been working in some isolation for more than ten years. Even the Anglican Diocese of Auckland has come on board. And we are excited by our new hire, Amy Ross, who is looking after the Eco Church initiative in Wellington, one of our most promising hubs for ecological activity and awareness.

We continue to be governed by a dedicated and hardworking Board, and we welcomed two new members this year: Mary Hutchinson and Pete Armstrong. Pete is an engineer who has volunteered at Karioi, and Mary is an ex-GP, photographer and environmental activist.

Another of the highlights of this year was the international aspect of ARANZ. All 22 A Rocha Organisations signed a new Covenant and we welcomed a new International Director, Simon Stuart.

"We take too much away and don't give enough back. This is a tiny re-balance." - Isa




EDUCATION & ENGAGEMENT

ECO CHURCH NZ PROJECT

The Eco Church NZ Project is a bold new initiative of A Rocha Aotearoa New Zealand to support churches to actively care for God's earth as an integral part of their mission. Soft launched in July 2020 amidst COVID-19 restrictions, we welcomed 8 churches and 1 diocese to the Eco Church whānau in 2020.

















I think it is great that we can be an Eco Church and that we have the Eco Church network. It is an important network to support each other and to hear ideas about how other churches do things.
